Formatting:

1. Font: Times New Roman

2. Size: 12 pt

- 3. All pre-ambulatory words must be in italics.
- 4. All operative words must be in bold and underlined.
- 5. Pre-ambulatory clauses should not be numbered.
- 6. Pre-ambulatory clauses can not have sub clauses.
- 7. Operative clauses must be numbered (1, 2, 3 ...). All sub-clauses must be numbered in the latin alphabet (a, b, c ...). All sub-sub-clauses must be numbered in roman numerals (i, ii, iii ...).
- 8. All numbers in operative clauses must be followed by a period.
- 9. In pre-ambulatory clauses, every clause should end with a comma. No exceptions.
- 10. In operative clauses, every sentence should be followed by a comma. The two exceptions are when listing, a colon should be used, and in the very last sentence of a clause a semicolon to indicate the end of a clause.
- 11. The header must follow the guide below:

Rules:

- 1. Only one main submitter may submit a resolution.
- 2. The maximum number of co-submitters may be 2.
- 3. The main submitter has to be the one to present the resolution to a committee.
- 4. Countries may be signatories to however many resolutions as they would like.

- 5. A country can only be a main submitter or cosubmitter to one resolution only.
- 6. A majority of 1/2 of the committee must be signatories to allow to resolution to be presented.
- 7. A majority of 2/3 of the committee must vote 'yes' to allow a resolution to pass.
- 8. (Only in the Security Council and Historical Security Council) Any 'no' vote from a P5 country (USA, UK, France, China and Russia) causes the entirety of the resolution to fail, regardless of the majority.
- 9. Observer states (such as the Palestinian Authority and the Vatican City) may not vote on any resolution.
- 10. If more than 3 unfriendly amendments to a resolution pass, the resolution fails.
- 11. Upon chair discretion, friendly amendments are applied.
- 12. For an unfriendly amendment to be applied to a resolution, a majority of 1/2 of the committee must agree.
